Teaching Idea #3 ~ Character Traits Assign each student one character from Holes. The student is to write a character description from the first person point of view. Click here to read all character descriptions. Teaching Idea #4 ~ Dig Activity The bags were placed on the floor in a grid formation. Students read clues to determine which bag they must "dig" into. The bags held objects from the story such as plastic lizards, a mini treasure chest, a can of very old peaches, a golden lipstick tube, and a fish fossil. After collecting the objects, students discussed the significance of each. Teaching Idea #5 ~ Onion Dip Onions play an important role in the characters' lives in the book Holes. Cover and heat until cheese is melted for 30 to 60 minutes. Add remaining ingredients. Cover and heat for 30 minutes. Serve with raw vegetables, crackers, or bread pieces. After reading, ask students to identify a goal they have for the school year and write about the challenges they must overcome to achieve it. Encourage them to reflect upon the lessons they learned from Stanley's experience to devise a plan to persevere. To conclude, ask them to write about how they will feel if they achieve their goal and the emotions they'll experience if they don't. Reading novels like Holes, featuring strong-willed and determined characters like Stanley, is a great way for students to learn about perseverance and the important role it will play in their future success.
